











IDELIA'S STORY

Jerry Stoller envisioned a childcare facility, birth to preschool, that provided single mothers the opportunity to pursue employment, education, and a better future for their families. He also knew children learned better in a safe environment. In 2013, Jerry founded a nonprofit Christian childcare center. Inspired by his years spent at the University of Illinois, he named the Houston-based charity Nabor House Community after his first collegiate home, the Nabor House Fraternity.

Jerry had a heart for single mothers and low-income families and felt a sense of responsibility to help them and their children become self-sufficient and independent. He did so by offering a "hand-up" rather than a "hand-out." Today, Nabor House Community has not only served over 500 children, but has also enriched the lives of entire families through the power and love of Jesus Christ.
